Various disciplines investigate the qualities that organizations and their members need to generate, share, and store information for responsible decision-making, yet often in isolation from each other. We aim to bridge these disciplinary boundaries by **bringing together fifteen scholars working across philosophy, organizational studies, psychology, sociology, and law.**

Topics that the conference presentations explore include:

- **Foundational topics** such as whether responsibility for actions based on group beliefs transmits to the members of the organization or whether willful ignorance leads to equal culpability;
- **Psychological issues** such as what we can learn from research on conspiracy theories about organizational decision making or whether organizations can generate trust from mistrust; and
- **Applied issues** such as platform surveillance, corporate bullshit, and the impact of workplace democracy on corporate decision making.
